# A. Discussion with Members: What should the core values/beliefs be in Surrey Elementary Athletics? – Glenn Young to Lead

- What are our core values?
- What is SEAS about?
  - Providing positive experiences for everyone, introducing sports to everyone, connecting with kids you may not know otherwise, skill development, opportunities for kids who wouldn't have a chance otherwise—sportsmanship, aside from skills, etc.
  - What about excellence?—should not be a part of it because we don't have time to develop it.
    - In the handbook, we had a page full of values and a lot of them we need to revisit as some conflict.
    - Can we be about participation and excellence at the same time? Can they co-exist?
    - Long-term athlete development model 7 stages in this progression of developing an athlete—from the playground to the podium.

- Rarely do kids say the reason they want to play is to winmainly for socialization, making friends.
- Why do they quit?- lack of playing time, lack of success, little skill improvement, lack of fun, overemphasis of winning, too much criticism from coach.
  - Perceived competence—how the kids think they are—this is a huge determent to their continuing to participate.
- Overall, our schools have done a good job of over rotations, etc. and including all players.
- Are we infusing competition too early?
  - Competition—a process of social comparison—the kids compete in everything, and how they base their competence.
  - Kids will keep score regardless if we keep score...for something to be competitive, the end result needs to be in doubt...how do we make it more competitive? - keep score, but don't keep score after one team is dominating - both teams learn winning and losing - if one dominates, what are they learning?
    - How do you know that before you start?
  - We need to readdress our values in order to make sure we are all in line with what is going on—e.g. Double shifting, etc.—want to make sure we are valuing the same things.
    - This should help us to make sure things like this don't happen.
      - We need to be more goal oriented vs. result based
    - Overemphasis on winning—focus too much on defense
- Cutting players—try not to cut—Glenn is trying to not have kids cut at the grade 8 level—we want to keep as many kids active as possible.
- In our society, we sometimes focus on specialization too early—there are positive attributes from practice in a variety of different sporting experiences—a lot of positive transferability within this.
- B. Motion to move to 4 on 4 Volleyball? Hugh McDonald
  - Idea is to have less kids on the floor, but encouraging more movement—2 schools, 3 teams per school
    - Comments: can it happen in practice vs. changing the format; resources are an issue—not all schools can foster 4 v.4 in practice; is the space you're playing in going to be restricted; is it possible to reduce the number of schools at each site without changing from 6 v. 6?
    - Glenn we want to go back to focusing on mvmt. vs skill we need to teach the movement.
    - 4 v. 4 encourages movement instead of certain position per 6 spots on floors.
    - Are we going to reach a consensus on this?
      - Proposal to try this for a year and see how it goes
        - Do we have enough time to develop skill?
- C. Members Motions -- Motion to propose 4 v. 4 volleyball for one year. Votes for: 34 against: 37 – Motion <u>NOT</u> passed

### S.E.S.A.A. TREASURER'S REPORT – 2013-2014

This year was a year of change for the Surrey Elementary Athletic Society. Along with our name and logo change, we also changed financial institutes. To save money, we changed financial institutions from the Royal Bank to Vancity.

The Society's levies were again \$75.00 per participating school this year. The collection of these fees amounted to \$7575.00, deposited into the Society's new Vancity account. As of April 11, 2014, our account sits at a healthy \$9643.40. Our major expenses this year were:

\$4705.57 for Ribbons, much of which will be recouped when we receive orders from the individual schools. We currently subsidize a small amount of each ribbon which puts our actual cost at a fraction of the amount spent.

\$2457.00 for the Annual General Meeting, much of which comes from the levy fees paid by the individual participating schools. We have capped a limit of 6 teacher-coaches per school this year.

Other expenses and anticipated expenses include those for the t-shirts, the domain name for our new name – the Surrey Elementary Schools Athletic Association, gifts for volunteers and honoured guests, awards for coaching excellence and 20 coaching awards, AGM ticket ordering, and field costs from the City of Surrey.

The 2013 season went very well. We enjoyed a four (4) week season as we had to cancel the Oct. 1 run due to poor weather.

We are happy to report an increase in the number of participating schools from last year (24 schools this year as compared to 16 last year). We had a total of 2422 runners accumulated over the 4 week season. Overall gender breakdown of participants was 52% male and 48% female. Participation across grades indicated high levels of participation in Grade 3, spiking at Grade 4 and a gradual reduction in numbers through to grade 7.

We decided not to have an Organizational Meeting this year. Instead, I contacted all Central/West Zone principals via email and requested that they forward schedule details to the sponsoring teachers. This worked very well.



#### 1. ORGANIZATIONAL MEETINGS:

#### 4. RECOMMENDATIONS:

No new recommendations were made this season. A few coaches asked about indoor soccer as a category. Perhaps that can be included for next season if there are enough schools interested. Registration will be sent out sooner with clear dates on Play Day.

#### 5. DATES FOR NEXT YEAR:

#### 1. ORGANIZATIONAL MEETINGS:

The Basketball Referee Clinic was held on January 19, 2014, at Simon Cunningham. Dean Maion, PE Helping Teacher and certified BCBOA referee, walked coaches through basic refereeing skills and general basketball rules. The three convenors (Rachel Baldry, Ron Dorland and Erik Henderson) assisted. Turnout at the Referee clinic was good with approximately 25 coaches. Glenn Young held the ABC's of Basketball with the assistance of Ron Dorland on January 14, 2014, at Simon Cunningham. There were approximately 14 coaches in attendance.

Basketball registration and participation this year were excellent. Last year we had 87 out of 99 schools participate (87%). This year, we had 90 out of 101 schools (89%).

#### 2. ZONE PLAY REPORT/FINAL RESULTS:

Zone Play appeared to run smoothly. There were less challenges with late registrations but this will continue to be something that we monitor.

We used the strategy of holding league play schedules in hopes of having Play Day hosts confirmed prior to zone play commencing, to avoid the last minute struggle of finding hosts and getting ribbons to school sites in time for Play Day. For the most part, most zones had schools volunteer to host Play Days much earlier than in previous years. This was effective in all zones except the East zone. It was frustrating for some schools in the East zone who had Play Day hosts for their subzone (based on school size within the zone), but couldn't get their schedules as a result of other subzones who still did not have hosts. We recommend that we continue to use the same strategy to promote Play Day hosts as it was effective within the majority of the zones. We will continue to offer support in terms of planning/coordinating Play Days for those who are reluctant to host. There were some challenges in the North West zone in terms of host sites. Recommendations were made last year to no longer host Play Days at Queen Elizabeth. Play Day hosts were determined prior to zone play commencing. At the last minute, a few schools expressed a keen interest in having those who were interested play at Queen Elizabeth. This will

be something that will be revisited in a more timely manner next year with the inclusion of the zone coordinator to avoid potential scheduling obstacles within the zone.

A few amendments were made in the S.E.A.S. Handbook in terms of the explanations of a few rules. Clarification was made in regards to setting picks/ screens. There was also some confusion in regards to over and back violations. An e-mail was sent out to all coaches clarifying and elaborating the details and this will soon be revised in more detail in the handbook.


- Play Days in the North-West Zone will be encouraged to remain at elementary school sites. Those interested in hosting at Queen Elizabeth, please communicate your interest prior to zone play starting to your zone coordinator.
- Continue to hold basketball workshops at Simon Cunningham Elementary.
- Play Day hosts should continue to be confirmed before sending out finalized league play schedules to make ribbon distribution easier
- Have Zone Coordinators send out reminders to past and present coaches to be aware of registration deadlines and what zone they are in.
- Continue to offer organizational support to potential Play Day hosts.
- Edit/elaborate the explanation of over and back violations in the hand book.
- Schools who register past the deadline can still attend Play Day, but need to set up their own league games
- Continue to host Play Days at 12:30 p.m.

#### 1. ORGANIZATION:

This year, registration was done through the Zone Coordinators. Most schools were successful in getting their schools/teams registered on time. We had a few schools that missed getting their teams on the list and registered late. This resulted in a few zones having their schedules revised multiple times. The zone information is now posted on the new SESAA Blog <a href="http://www.sesaa.org">http://www.sesaa.org</a>. Please be sure to check online the zone where your school belongs. A HUGE thank you to all of the Zone Coordinators for their time and patience in accommodating late schools and for making the schedule revisions.

An ABCs of Volleyball Workshop was presented by Glenn Young, District PE Helping Teacher. Our turnout for this was smaller than last year – possibly due to late advertising of the workshop. Thank you to Janice Churchill Elementary for hosting in their gym and to Glenn for organizing this!

#### 2. ZONE PLAY:

Zone play seemed to run smoothly with few or no big concerns. Having the handbook posted on the blog was very helpful, particularly for new coaches.

We had 90 schools participate in Volleyball this season with 41 Play Days taking place. This is the same participation number as last year's. The Central and East zones were broken down into 4 school size groupings for Play Day as their school participation numbers were high. The other zones competed in 3 school size categories. Establishing hosts for Play Days was problematic for a couple of zones as schools were reluctant to step up.

There were a few B Team tournaments that were organized, as well as a Co-ed tournament organized at Strawberry Hill. Thank you to all of these coaches for organizing these events to provide more kids with the opportunity to participate.

Thank you to the Zone Coordinators for their efforts and hard work this season. They worked very hard to organize, revise and post schedules onto the SESAA blog, as well as ensured that hosts were found for Play Days. Thank you!

#### 3. BUDGET:

Ribbons and Rosettes:. There was some confusion regarding "B" team Play Days and coaches expecting to be provided with ribbons and rosettes for these. There are a substantial number of participation ribbons leftover from the past two years so we will likely be looking at ordering half of what we normally would for next year.


#### 4. RECOMMENDATIONS:

- To continue with registration via the zone coordinators.
- Continue with ABCs of Volleyball clinic with our PE Helping teacher to support coaches and promote skill development.
- Consider the move to a 4 vs 4 format to improve movement and skill development as was encouraged by the high school coaches and Volleyball BC at a meeting at DEC.
- Clarify the expectation regarding ribbons for B team Play Days.
- As the East Zone continues to grow, explore splitting this zone.

#### 1. ORGANIZATIONAL MEETINGS:

The league registration was completed on-line. Beginning February 1 and continuing through February 22, coaches and contacts registered their teams for either Grade 7 league play, or grade 5/6 league play. The coaches were offered a workshop to assist in the preparation of their season. There were 33 coaches present at the workshop.

#### 2. SYNOPSIS:

The badminton teams were scheduled to begin league play March 4 for grade 5/6, and March 6 for grade 7. There were 61 schools registered in the grade 7 league, and 44 schools registered in the grade 5/6 league. This represents a 15-percent increase over the number of teams participating in the previous year. Assuming an average of 20 students per team, the participation in badminton this year was estimated to be approximately 2100 students. All zones were adequately represented.

#### 3. FINAL RESULTS:

A number of Play Days were held at a variety of locations. There were 19 host schools for the grade 7 league, and 15 host schools for the grade 5/6 league. The majority of the Play Day sites involved three schools; but due to numbers and locations, it was necessary to arrange a small number of 4-school tournaments. The leagues did not separate the Play Day groups into competitive versus recreational play.

#### 4. BUDGET THIS YEAR:

This year the budget for ribbons and rosettes was \$700.00, which did not include a release day. The budget recommendation for 2014-2015 is \$700.00 for ribbons and rosettes, and a release day for the convenor.

#### 5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

We should keep the same dates for next year. Consideration should also be given to the idea of having 4-school play day tournaments as the norm, and to use the 3-school groupings only when the numbers don't allow for the 4-school system. This increases the amount of playing time for the students, but makes the required time for the tournament much longer; all Play Days would need to begin prior to the end of the school day. Thought should also be given to offering coaches a chance to register their team to participate in a competitive Play Day, based upon their team demonstrating high-level skills during regular league play. This creates a more equal tournament, but may necessitate further travel distance for those participating teams.

#### 1. ORGANIZATIONAL MEETINGS:

No organization meeting was held. Registration was on-line, February 24 – March 7, via a google form linked from the SESAA website and facebook page, as well as in an email sent out to all former Ultimate coaches and school PE contacts. Things went very smoothly. Late registrants were added by the convenors. A coaching contact list was distributed via e-mail to all registered schools. A total of 31 schools were registered at the beginning of the season.

#### 2. ZONE PLAY REPORT:

Mini-tournaments, exhibition games and skills clinics were organized by coaches. They were held over a five-week period in April and May.

#### 3. FINAL RESULTS:

#### Celebration Play Day:

Play Day was held on May 1 at South Surrey Athletic Park. There were 27 schools in attendance with a total of 28 teams. Approximately 500 student athletes attended this year's Play Day. The tournament hosted two divisions, competitive and recreational. Representatives and players from the Vancouver Nighthawks Ultimate team were also in attendance, handing out stickers, buttons, and selling tickets, as well as sharing their expertise while working small groups of players, coaches, and teams.

10 teams took part in the competitive division, 5 teams in each of the 2 pools. These teams played 4 games in a round robin tournament. Following the round robin, the 5<sup>th</sup> ranked team from each of the two pools was eliminated. The 8 remaining teams played off in cross-pool, quarter-final games. The 4 winning teams then played off in semifinal games. The two losing teams played off for 3<sup>rd</sup> place while the 2 winning teams played off in a final game for 1<sup>st</sup> place. Each game lasted 15 minutes. A rosette and ribbons for 1<sup>st</sup> place were awarded to A.J. McLellan and ribbons for 2<sup>nd</sup> place were awarded to Chantrell Creek. 3<sup>rd</sup> place ribbons were awarded to Simon Cunningham and 4<sup>th</sup> place ribbons were awarded to Bonaccord. The eliminated teams were awarded with participation ribbons.

18 teams took part in the recreational division, with 6 teams in each of the 3 pools. These teams played 5 games in a round robin tournament. Each game lasted 20 minutes. Scores were not recorded. The emphasis of the recreational division was on having fun, being active, and team spirit. Spirit games, costumes, and cheers were encouraged in this division but were not mandatory. Coaches were given participation ribbons for each of their athletes. Coaches were also asked to vote for the team in their pool most deserving of a spirit award. On field 6,

the spirit award went to Forsyth Road. On field 7, the spirit award went to Betty Huff. On field 8, the spirit award went to Fraser Wood. Spirit awards were delivered to the deserving schools.

Overall, the tournament ran very smoothly. The venue was excellent and the new format of the tournament was well received.

After no interest from any other school, Pacific Heights volunteered to host the concession. The concession brought in over \$1300.00 this year with the net figure being close to \$900.00.

#### Concerns:

Not all teams, athletes, and coaches are aware of the general rules and etiquette of play. It is highly recommended that all review and refer to the rules as outlined in the SESAA handbook.

Several schools changed in their commitment of their teams participation in the tournament. Many teams did so with less than a week before Play Day, after the schedule had been set and distributed to coaches. This fluctuation inconveniently caused the need for the entire tournament to be rescheduled and restructured at the last minute.

#### 4. BUDGET:

*Ribbons:* 15 first place, 15 second place, 15 third place, 15 fourth place, 450 participation *Rosettes:* 1 first place Release time for Convenors: 2 days

#### 5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Keep the Play Day format the same for next year, offering a choice of either participation in the competitive division or in the recreational division.
- One team per school at Play Day.
- Impose a deadline for confirmation of each school's Play Day team.
- Book the 4 grass fields at South Surrey Athletic Park.
- To continue with on-line registration via a google form.
- To host in association with the Vancouver Nighthawks or the Vancouver Ultimate League, a coaching clinic at the beginning of the season to help coaches learn skill development and the rules of play.
- To encourage coaches to stay informed with the rules of play and to promote spirit of the game among student athletes.
- The opportunity to host the concession will be offered to all participating schools; a draw will be held to determine host.
- To continue to include a garbage bag with each team's registration package and to offer a proper recycling bag to help eliminate plastic bottle as waste.

#### 6. RECOMMENDED DATES FOR NEXT YEAR:

*Online Registration:* February 16 - February 27 *League Play:* March 23 – April 24 *Celebration Play Day:* April 27, 28, 29, or 30 (depending on field availability)

#### 7. BUDGET NEEDS FOR NEXT YEAR:

Budget should increase to include cost of the Spirit Awards for the recreational division as well as additional participation ribbons.

#### 8. WILLING TO SERVE AS CONVENORS AGAIN?

Kim Buchanan and Paul Thompson are willing to remain as Ultimate co-convenors again next year.
