

BUDGET REPORT 2018-2019 Annual Report

District Funding and Support

The district continues to pay for some release time for those coordinating events. The district also pays for supplying championship material such as wristbands, rosettes, and ribbons for our playdays and events. We continue to be supported by our district and we are thankful for their financial involvement.

SESAA Account

Our bank account continues to be in a healthy position (as shown below). This account is funded by the annual school levy of \$100.00. We use this account to cover release time for event coordination, coaching recognition awards, AGM expenses, and on-going expenses such as starter caps and equipment for track meets and other sports that require additional equipment to operate. The balance currently seems high but we haven't paid for the AGM.

We try and keep a healthy balance of about \$5,000.00 from year to year. This balance will be used when emergencies arise which might include: needing more release days, purchasing equipment for sports, buying additional bracelets, etc.

Motion for School Levy 2019-2020

The school athletic levy continues at \$10,100.00 for the 2019-2020 school year.

Rationale: We continue to need this money to fund the items the district does not cover as listed above. We will always continue to need this additional money to allow us to operate completely.

ORGANIZATIONAL MEETINGS:

The Basketball Referee Clinic was held on January 17, 2018 at Pacific Heights Elementary. Turnout at the Referee clinic was good, with about 20 coaches attending. Scott McIndoe ran the ABC's of Basketball this year and had close to 25 coaches attending. Basketball registration and participation this year was still strong and consistent with last year's results.

ZONE PLAY REPORT/FINAL RESULTS:

Zone Play seemed to run smoothly this season. Celebration Day ribbons were substituted for wristbands this year. Participation ribbons/wristbands were not rewarded this season. There were a couple of inappropriate behaviors with parent coaches at two basketball Celebration Days this season. Sponsor Teachers need to make sure their parent coaches are following the Elementary Coaches Code of Conduct; especially being respectful to referees and other coaches.

ORGANIZATIONAL MEETINGS:

- Most coaches familiar with process some schools still working on coordination of coaches so that teams are not registered multiple times
- A reminder to schools to double check their school zone as posted on the SESAA website

ZONE PLAY REPORT/FINAL RESULTS:

Return to 6 on 6 was received with mixed reviews. Some schools were happy to be back to 6 players on the court while others noticed a significant decrease of movement on the court. Some coaches have recommended that 5 on 5 may be the better balance of players on the court. This should be discussed at some point in the future, following another year of 6 on 6.

Participation was similar to last year, with most schools participating in girls, boys, or coed. Distribution of celebration play day bracelets was facilitated through DEC. Thank you to those schools who stepped up early to host the celebration playdays. Identifying host schools early in the season helps the zone coordinators in their planning and scheduling.

BUDGET:

Bracelet distribution through DEC continues to work well – again, need to identify hosts early so that items arrive in time for the playday.

- Continue with online registration
- Continue with ABCs of Volleyball clinic facilitated by PE Helping Teacher

ORGANIZATIONAL MEETINGS:

The league registration was primarily completed through a google doc, as well as emailing information. Beginning February 4th and continuing through February 15th, coaches and contacts registered their teams for either Grade 7 league play, or Grade 5/6 league play. Interested coaches were offered a workshop on February 20th to assist in the preparation of their season. The workshop was attended by 26 coaches and consisted of 90 minutes of drills and technical discussions.

ZONE PLAY REPORT/FINAL RESULTS:

The badminton teams were scheduled to begin league play March 5th for grade 5/6, and March 7th for grade 7. There were 71 schools registered in the grade 7 league, and 52 schools registered in the grade 5/6 league. This number represents a nineteen percent increase in the number of teams participating from the previous year. Assuming an average of 20 students per team, the participation in badminton this year was estimated to be approximately 2460 students, with all zones represented.

There were 128 teams registered for the end of season play days. The teams were arranged into forty sites of either three-school tournaments (80 percent) or four-school tournaments (20 percent) for these games. Some teams had to withdraw prior to the play day.

BUDGET:

This year the budget for wristbands and rosettes was \$. The budget recommendation for 2019-2020 is to maintain the budget at \$700.00 for wristbands/ribbons and rosettes, and a release day for the convenor.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR NEXT YEAR:

Consider reverting back to providing ribbons for the participants of the play day tournaments instead of the wristbands. Consider providing rosettes for all participating teams, and not just a first-place rosette.

1. ORGANIZATIONAL MEETINGS: The committee meets once in early Spring to discuss the upcoming meets, any changes and review responsibilities.

2. ZONE PLAY REPORT/FINAL RESULTS:

This year, we had 413 athletes from 67 different schools over two days, with only six schools left on the wait list. We reconfigured the field events to have athletes rotating in their school groups. We added another field event - soccer, so that even more athletes could participate in the meets. Due to these changes, the feedback we received was that the meets ran even more efficiently. The district funded a souvenir baseball hat for each athlete featuring our speedy bunny logo and Challenger Baseball gave away water bottles. Athletes went home with hats, pins. water bottles, ribbons, medallions and coupons from McDonald's. Many teams stopped for ice-cream and hamburgers on the way back to their schools. We had approximately 40 volunteers each day from the City of Surrey, TD bank, KSW Law Firm and of course, Surrey Schools, Retired Principal, Connie McLean once again, coordinated all the volunteers and they are key to the success of the meets! We heard many heart-warming stories such as: several athletes said this day was better than Christmas, one athlete said he had shivers when they put the medal over his head and it truly was the best day of his life, one little girl spoke for the first time all year.

ORGANIZATIONAL MEETINGS:

No organization meeting was held. Registration was on-line, February 4 – February 15 via a Google form linked from the SESAA website and Facebook page as well as in an email sent out to all former ultimate coaches. Late registrants were added by the convenors. A coaching contact list was distributed, via e-mail, to all registered schools. A total of 44 schools registered this season. A coaching clinic was held at Katzie Elementary on April 9th from 3:30pm - 5:00pm.

ZONE PLAY REPORT/FINAL RESULTS:

Exhibition games were organized by coaches. They were held over a six-week period in March and April. The celebration jamboree was held on Wednesday, May 1st at South Surrey Athletic Park. There was a total of 36 schools and approximately 700 student athletes in attendance. The tournament hosted two divisions: competitive and recreational. 12 teams took part in the competitive division with an initial round robin phase that ranked teams and an elimination phase determined the champion, Katzie who was awarded a first-place rosette and bracelets. 2nd to 3rd place bracelets were awarded to Berkshire Park and Crescent Park. All other eliminated teams received SESAA Athlete participation bracelets. 24 teams took part in the recreational division and followed a round robin format. No scores were kept and the teams were not ranked. Participation bracelets were awarded to all players. A spirit trophy will be presented to the two most deserving teams, Cougar Creek and Bridgeview, based on a vote by the coaches from the recreational division. Bonaccord hosted the concession.

ORGANIZATIONAL MEETINGS:

There was an organizational/planning meeting held on Thursday, Sept. 13, 2019 at Simon Cunningham Elementary. As is usually the case, most information was sent out via email, but about 10-15 coaches attended the meeting to set up games and clarify uncertainties (about rules, scheduling, etc.).

ZONE PLAY REPORT/FINAL RESULTS:

Coaches registered their teams through a google form Sean Juteau sent out via email to PE contacts and last year's coaches. Christian and I compiled the list of teams and coaches for each school and organized them into zones (to help coaches set up games with their surrounding schools).

The majority of schools had no problem establishing their own games and most had 2-3 before their play-days. Some asked about a schedule, but based on how long it took teams to register and how short the soccer season is, I don't think that this will work. Coaches found the email list useful.

There were 34 Boys "A" (a small increase from 31 last year), 14 Girls "A" (a significant drop from 22 last year), 3 Boys "B" (the same as last year), and 16 Co-Ed (a small increase from 15 last year) teams that participated in 19 different play-days. In total, over 1 000 students played soccer this fall.

Schools were divided into small tournaments of 3 or 4 teams based on location (and in some cases school size). All teams played each other once and most tournaments had time for a game between the top two teams. Bracelets and rosettes were awarded to the first and second placed teams. Coaches or parents volunteered to referee games.

Schools with good grass/turf fields were asked or volunteered to serve as hosts. In 8 cases, Surrey Parks turf fields were used only until 3:30 (Newton Athletic, South Surrey Athletic and Cloverdale Athletic), which helped to cut costs. Sean Juteau assisted in booking Surrey Parks fields and in ensuring that all school fields were safe and lined prior to play-days.

Weather did not turn out to be an issue this year, as it has in the past. All play-days were able to go ahead as planned.

BUDGET:

Bracelets and rosettes – refer to PE Secretary who placed order.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR NEXT YEAR:

- Bracelets and rosettes orders were placed in advance by Sean Juteau and this allowed them to arrive just in time to reach host schools. Even earlier next year would be better (although I think this would make coming up with accurate projections difficult).
- Continue to use Google Forms to collect registration information
- Continue to keep the number of teams at each tournament at 3 or 4 (unless side-byside city fields can be booked)
- If possible encourage schools to have their teams finalized before the final playday schedule comes out. We had a lot of revisions after the final schedule was released causing a lot of last-minute switches for host schools.

DATES FOR NEXT YEAR:

The organizational meeting should be hosted around the same time next year (close to Sept 13). Play-Days were well placed on the week of Oct. 8-12.

The 2018 season went very well. We didn't keep track of the athletes' places related to each school and I actually received positive feedback from the coaches about not keeping track. We were able to run all five meets. We seemed to have roughly the same number of schools (16-18) who participated in the previous year. We had a total of 2036 runners cross the finish line this year which was up from last year's 1273 runner count. This isn't surprising considering we had all five meets (two more than last year) this year. The overall breakdown of participants was 53% boys and 47% girls. Participation across grades indicated high levels of participation in Grade 3 -5 and a reduction in numbers in grade 6/7 which isn't usually surprising considering the soccer season running at the same time and the opportunity for 6/7 students to play other school sports throughout the year.
