## **BARRY MORLEY TRACK MEET 2026**

Welcome to the Barry Morley Memorial Track Meet. This year one hundred schools have registered for track and field!

**Barry Morley** began teaching in Surrey in the 1960's. He became a district P.E. helping teacher in 1971. Barry was instrumental in starting the district track meets and created the schedule we are still using today. Barry was passionate about all areas of physical education and championed daily P.E.

It is our goal as coordinators to organize a safe, enjoyable, competitive meet for all participants. In the program, every school has been assigned a station to officiate for the day. Previous experience at your station is not necessary. We will give you on-the-spot training and by the end of the day you will be an expert! **Please note that the district does not provide release time to officiate an event.** Occasionally changes in assignments occur the day of the track meet. We thank you for your cooperation.

Thank you to all officials for your hard work during your track meet and helping to keep these six days, "The Best Days of the Year."



### **Here are a few important messages for the officials coming from your school:**

- It is expected that schools officiating field events will have three officials throughout the day
- All equipment and record keeping materials are provided
- All field event officials will receive their instructions from the field event coordinators
- It is very important in the field events that all athletes make their first attempt before their second attempt, etc. They do not perform three consecutive attempts
- Please have your officials read the Track and Field Regulations in the program that describe how to officiate the specific events. One key regulation in all jumping and throwing events is the "0" end of the tape measure is placed where the implement touches down or the heels make contact in the sand and the tape is pulled back to the throwing circle or takeoff board
- Please do not hesitate to get clarification from one of the coordinators

**Here are a few important items to help make your day an enjoyable one:**

- Bring at least two roster sheets. The officials stand requires one roster sheet at the beginning of the meet
- There will be a pre-arranged seating plan
- Listen carefully for names of your athletes who have received a ribbon
- Maximize participation – 2 athletes per event per category (4 athletes for relays)
- Individual athletes can compete in a maximum of 5 activities (3 events and 2 relays or 4 events and 1 relay).
- If a younger athlete competes in an older category – they must remain in that category for the entire meet.
- Please communicate to your students and parents that placing first in a heat does not necessarily qualify the athlete for a ribbon. The 80m, 100m, and 200m have final races. In all other races the eight fastest times in the heats determine who receives the ribbons
- All athletes can also have name tag for each event. Please safety-pin them to T-shirts instead of sticking them on. Tell your athletes that tags are taken at the end of races and at the beginning of field events. The name tags need to follow this format:

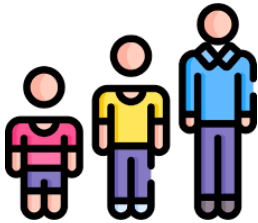
- Label Size Recommended: 1.6cm x 8.9cm Do not use larger or wider tags
  - Please make sure the name of the competitor, event and school are legible (preferably typed)
  - A nametag is required for every event the athlete is competing
  - Schools must supply their own nametags
- Field event athletes will be registered in advance on-line
  - Coaches: Please keep checking at the two ribbon booths for unclaimed ribbons. Track ribbons are picked up below the recording stand, field ribbons at the south end of the track (by the long and triple jump). **Scoring points are calculated as follows:**

## AGE GROUPS

- Athletes who do not show up for marshalling for track events on time will NOT be placed in a heat at the end of the schedule. They will simply miss their event
- Athletes who are competing in a field and track event at the same time, must check in at both the field and track events, go to the field event first, and notify the official when they need to leave, go run the track event, and rejoin the field event as soon as possible, notifying the official again

<b>TYKE</b>	Born 2016 or later

**The number of events students may enter will be controlled as follows:**

<b>TYKES, PEE WEES &amp; BANTAMS</b>	4 individual events plus 1 relay; OR 3 individual events plus 2 relays
<b>TINY SCHOOLS</b>	4 individual events plus 2 relays

Individual competing in more than the allowable events will have all their awarded points deducted from their teams total!

# **REGULATIONS FOR ATHLETES**

## **TRACK**

- All races up to and including 400 meters will be run in lanes
- Both feet must be in contact with the ground when starting
- Competitors must not place hands or fingers on the starting line
- A false start will be signaled by the firing of a second shot (or a whistle)
- Athletes are only allowed one false start
- Athletes must stay in lanes during and after the race
- The finish of a race is marked by the torso (chest area) crossing the perpendicular plane of the nearer edge of the finish line
- A person not participating is not allowed to pace the athlete
- A winner of a heat does not necessarily win a ribbon. Some races are timed finals, others will have a final race

## **RELAYS**

- The person who drops a baton must pick it up
- An athlete must not impede other runners
- Incoming runners must stay in their lane until the track is cleared
- The baton must be handed over in the exchange zone, not thrown
- It is the baton that is judged as being in or out of the exchange zone, not the runner
- The baton cannot be received before or after the exchange zone
- Runners must be in the correct lane and remain in the correct lane throughout the race
- Remain in the lane after the finish of the race
- Medley:
  - Tykes: 50m x 50m x 100m x 200m
  - Pewee and Bantam: 100m x 100m x 200m x 400m

## **TIMING**

- Two watches will be on first. A disagreement results in an average of the two times
- Start on the flash or smoke of the gun. Stop the watch when the torso crosses the finish line
- Do not return watch to zero until instructed to do so by the chief Timekeeper

## **DISTANCE RACES (600m, 800m, 1500m)**

- Runners must allow 2 strides on other athletes before cutting over to the curb lane Group start
- Runners must not impede other runners from passing on the outside
- Races 400m and above including relays may be Timed Finals therefore the runners are racing the clock
- Fastest runners are encouraged to run in the same heat

### **Please note:**

- Starting blocks will not be allowed
- If track shoes are worn, they must be equipped with pin spikes

## TRIPLE JUMP

- Hop-step-jump (e.g. right foot to right foot to left foot to both feet)
- If the leg not used in the hop touches the ground the jump is not counted
- Everything is the same as in the long jump

## LONG JUMP

- Competitors must jump on or behind the take- off board
- The distance is measured from the closest edge of the take-off board to the pit to the nearest mark left in the landing pit by the jumper
- Each competitor is allowed three jumps
- If ties occur the second furthest jump will be used
- If a tie still occurs the third furthest jump will be used One foot take-off only
- Leaving and returning competitors must inform the officials'. The zero end of the tape is placed at the mark in the pit

## HIGH JUMP

- Competitors must take off from one foot
- They may jump at any height above the minimum that they choose
- They are allowed three attempts at each height or if they miss their first or second attempt they may pass and compete at a higher height
- A competitor who fails three consecutive jumps is eliminated even if the jumps were not made at the same height
- If time is a factor the official may put a time limit on the competitor between the attempts on the bar after his/her name is called
- Competitors must inform official when leaving the high jump for other activities and must return as soon as possible and inform the official on return. The bar will not be lowered for returning competition
- Ties will be decided in the following manner:
  - a. The competitor with the lowest number of jumps at the height at which the tie occurs shall be awarded the higher place
  - b. If the tie still remains, the competitor with the lowest total of failures throughout the competition up to and including the height last cleared shall be awarded the higher place
  - c. If the tie still remains after (b) and concerns first place, the following procedure shall apply:
    - i) The tying competitors shall have one more jump at the lower height at which they failed
    - ii) If no decision is reached the height of the bar shall be lowered or raised to the heights which shall be announced by the Chief Judge of the event until the tie is broken;
    - iii) Tying competitors shall jump in the same order as in the competition proper
    - iv) They shall make one attempt only at each height and must jump on each occasion that the height of the bar is altered
  - d. If the tie concerns any other place than first place, the competitors shall be awarded the same place in the competition

## **SHOT PUT 6 lbs Circle 7 feet 49° sector \*Note 4 lbs - Tykes**

- Three throws are allowed
- The shot shall touch or be near the chin and neck area
- It is tossed with one hand only. It must land in 49° sector
- The hand shall not be brought behind the line of the shoulders which constitutes a throwing action and therefore a foul
- Competitor must leave by rear half of the circle
- Competitor must not step outside or on the rim of the circle during the toss Measurement the same as discus
- Ties the same as long jump

# OFFICIALS NEEDED FOR THE DISTRICT TRACK MEET

## 1 CLERK OF THE COURSE

- Announcer, Trouble Shooter, "GO TO" official (Previous experience with Track needed)

## 1 MARSHAL (PREFERABLE 2)

- Organize the athletes into their lanes. Be in contact with the head Judge via walkie talkie (experience with where the races begin, when athletes must remain in their lanes, when athletes may safely move to the inside lanes in the 600M, 800M, and how to instruct Relay Marshals etc. is required)

## 1 HEAD JUDGE

- Makes sure that the Judges are standing where they can see "down" the finish line, in contact with the Marshal or Starter with a walkie talkie, waves flag to indicate Judges are ready for the next race, keeps lanes past the finish line empty for safety, solves issues over finish, prepared to switch Judges in one Judge is having trouble choosing their placement

## 8 JUDGES

- Choose the assigned placement by looking for team color, hands out ribbons for each race, tell runners to move to the outside after the race, watches for the runners who finish one place faster and one place slower than their assigned ribbon in order to help fellow Judges

## 1 STARTER

- Stands 5M in front of the runner in the 8<sup>th</sup> lane, usually stand on the infield but may stand on the outside for relays and 400M in order to be able to see all the runners
- Calls, " ON YOUR MARK, SET (after everyone is in motion), fires gun when everyone is motionless, varies the time between set and the gun between 25 seconds so that runners do not anticipate the cadence from watching a THE 600m, 800m and 1500m CALLS ONLY, "ON YOUR MARK" and then fires the gun"
- Holds a flag up to indicate to the Judges/Timers and watches for a flag to indicate they are ready. Drops the flag before the count
- Fires the gun a second time if false start
- Wears sound suppressors and a red vest or pinnie

The equipment needed for the starting/finish line for the races is:

- Two dozen cones
- Two walkie talkies, one for the starter and one for the head judge
- Red pinnie for the starter
- Sound suppressors for the starter
- Megaphone for the starter
- Starting pistol/whistle.
- A flag for the starter and a flag for the head judge
- Sets of 1<sup>st</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> place ribbons for the eight judges
- Sixteen relay exchange batons

### **3 LONG JUMP OFFICIALS ( PREFERABLE 4)**

- 1 records, 1 measures, 1 rakes. If you have a 4<sup>th</sup> they stand at the athlete line and tell the athlete when to go
- Recorder's makes sure the rake is out before the next jumper comes
- Raker's smooth the sand after each jump and occasionally stops the jumping to pull sand back into where the jumpers are landing
- We advise that you measure the "FAST WAY" by stretching the tape out at the side of the sand pit with the "0" at the sand side of the jump board and watch if the jumper's shoe is over which is illegal

#### **Please note:**

- Starting blocks will not be allowed
- If track shoes are worn, they must be equipped with pin spikes

### **3 TRIPLE JUMP OFFICIALS (PREFERABLE 4)**

- 1 records, 1 measures, 1 rakes. If you have a 4<sup>th</sup> they stand at the athlete line and tell the athlete when to go
- Recorder's set up 3 jump lines duct tape at 4M, 5M and 6M and places ad different color cone at each "START"
- Recorders also instruct the athletes
- To practice a jump and choose a takeoff so that they will end in the sand and take off with their "3<sup>rd</sup>" jump from the runup, runners tell the Recorder which cone and line is their takeoff point. The jump is illegal if they step past their line.
- Measurer's stretch the tape with the "0" mark beside the closest cone – 1M is added if they jump legally from the second cone and 2M are added if they jump legally from the "3<sup>rd</sup>" cone.

The equipment needed for long jump and triple jump is:

- One rake, one push broom, one shovel
- Six cones
- One fifteen metre tape measure
- Roll of duct tape (Remove the tape at the end)
- Six sets of 1<sup>st</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> place ribbons
- Two clip boards and pencils
- For TRIPLE jump you need 12 – 3 sets of 4 matching colours

### **3 SHOT PUT OFFICIALS (PREFERABLE 4)**

- The Measure Official looks for where the shot touches down and holds the "0" mark on the tape at the edge of the divot nearest to the front edge of the circle or kickboard
- The Recorder stands in the circle until the Measurer and Raker are out of the landing quadrant.
- Recorder then tells the next person to enter the circle
- After instructing the athletes, the Recorder watches from the back half of the circle and leaves from the back half of the circle
- After instructing the athletes, the Recorder watches to make sure that the Shot Putter's elbow stay behind the putting hand out or that the putting hand or the elbow does not proceed the putting hand ie. Shot Putter does not throw the shot
- Recorder's make sure the Shot Putter does not step on the kickboard or step out the front of the circle during the shot put

- Recorder makes sure the Tykes are using a 4lb shot and the Pee Wees/Bantams are using a 6lb shot.
- Recorder measures by pulling the tape back with no loops towards the center of the circle and reads where the tape crosses the front of the circle or inside rim of the kickboard
- Raker's retrieve the shot and quickly smooths over the divot
- A 4<sup>th</sup> Official can measure at the circle while the Recorder records the shot put

The equipment needed for shot put is:

- One rake, one push broom
- 15m tape measure
- Two 4lb shots
- Two 6lb shots
- Two clipboards, pencils
- 12 cones

**\*\*\*NOTE: IF YOU OPERATE 2 OF THE SAME EVENT AT THE SAME TIME –  
YOU WILL NEED DOUBLE THE NUMBER OF OFFICIALS AND DOUBLE THE EQUIPMENT\*\*\***

## OPENING AND CLOSING PROCEDURES

- Arrange for someone to dig the long jump pit up to 6m and the triple jump pit up to 6m, then rake them smoothly
- When everyone arrives call a coaches meeting. Distribute schedules and answer last minute questions
- Call the students out to the track and have them sit in school teams
- Go over introductions, safety in particular keeping the infield clear, out-of-bounds, staying in confines of the tracks, bathrooms
- Point out where the Long Jump, Triple Jump and Shot Put are located
- Tell students if they are at a running event and their field event is called then they stay and run their race, then they go to the field event. If they are at a field event and their running event is announced, they tell the official then go to the running event.
- Throughout the meet the announcer reminds students of these procedures
- When you arrive at the 4 x 100m relays call only the one age group out at a time Tykes, Pee Wees, Bantams Girls or Boys

## CONCLUSION AT THE END OF THE DAY

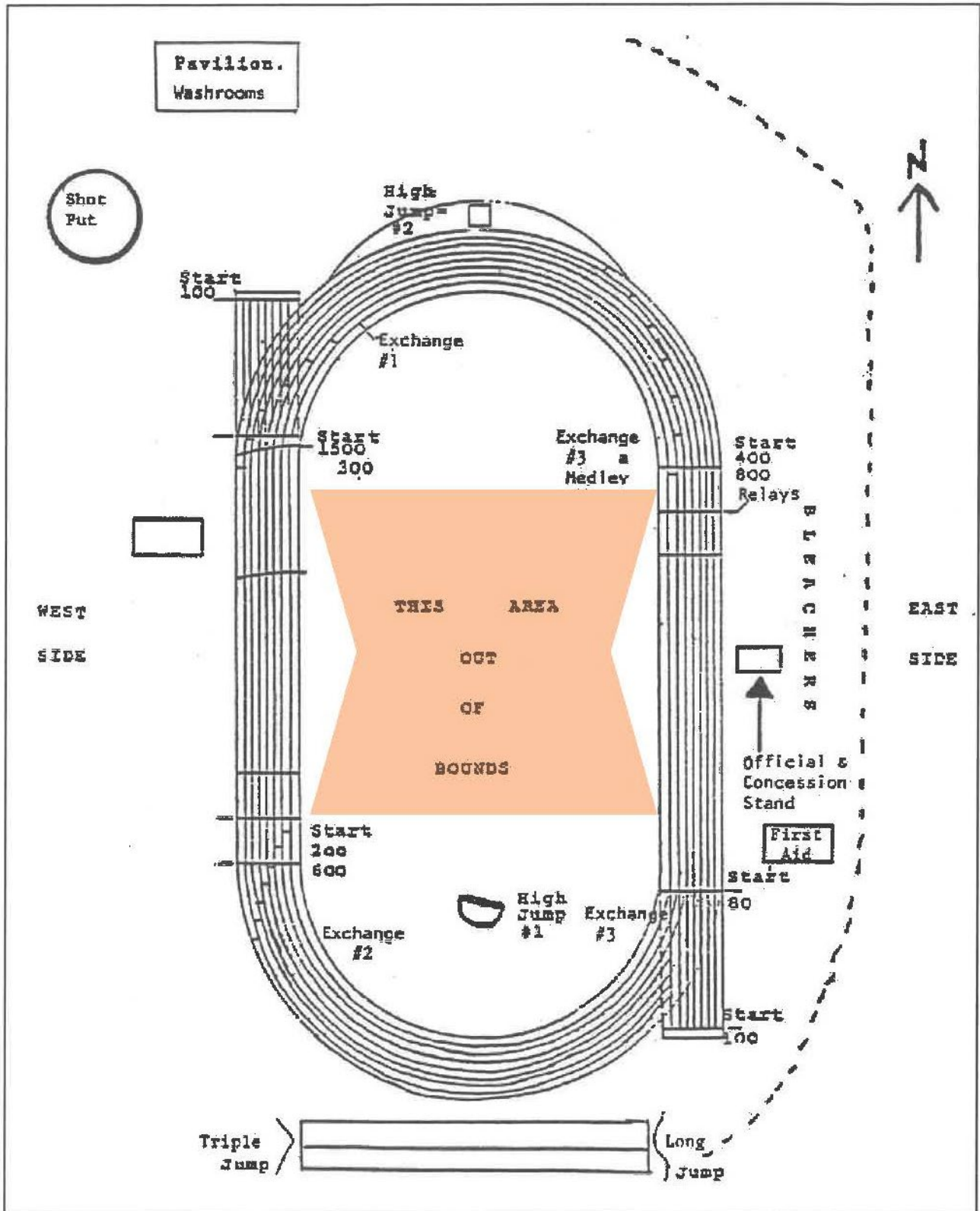
- Before you run the final relay, announce that everyone is going to do a major cleanup. Use the garbage bags that you brought to clean up the stands and surrounding area.
  - Thank all the officials for their time.
  - Thank parents for driving
  - Remind students to take all their belongings with them. **There is no lost and found.**
  - Remind everyone to leave the park on PRISTINE condition

## SAFETY AND SPORTSMANSHIP AT BEAR CREEK TRACK

- Out of bounds areas: **INFIELD**, all areas beyond the track and field area including the water park and playground area
- Remain in the track and field stadium
- Remain with your school
- Parents: Be vigilant to prevent preschoolers and primary students from running onto the track
- In order to get to and from the LJ, TJ, and Shot Put you must *go around the outside of the track*
- Cheer for your team, congratulate athletes you are competing with
- Keep the washrooms and track facility litter free
- Bring two bags of crushed ice and a cooler
- First Aid Kit
- A dozen large garbage bags
- Appropriate clothing for the weather and activities
- If track shoes are worn, they must be equipped with pin spikes
